Autauga County Master Gardeners Association welcomes you to Prattville, Alabama, for the 2025 Alabama Master Gardener Association Conference April 3-5 in the beautiful First Baptist Church. Located in Autauga County and nestled in the heart of Alabama, Prattville was established in 1833 when Daniel Pratt founded the town and built a cotton gin factory, which became the largest manufacturer of gins in the world. Today, gins are no longer manufactured in the historic buildings which anchor



downtown Prattville, but they remain as a reminder of the city's rich and storied history.

He earned his Ph.D. in Wildlife Ecology and Conservation at the University of Florida. His conference topic is *Bluebirds and Their Habitat*.

**Grover Plunkett, M.A.** is an assistant professor of history and political science at Faulkner University. He is presently earning a Ph.D. in International Relations and Economics at Auburn University and his research efforts include studies in the growth of capitalism in state-controlled markets, as well as the role of government in reversing the economic decline in American cities. His conference topic is **Agribusiness**, **Where We Have Been and Where We Are Going**.





**Laura Perry Johnson, Ph.D.** is Associate Dean of University of Georgia Cooperative Extension. As part of a cattle and row crop family in Moultrie, Georgia, agriculture has always been a part of her life.
